


## Alex Kanevsky Liberation & Disorientation

Inspired by the concept of unstable equilibrium in physics, Alex Kanevsky, who studied theoretical mathematics at Vilnius University in Lithuania before pursuing an artistic career in the United States, creates compositions that defy easy interpretation and understanding. This is particularly felt in his treatment of the figure, which is often depicted in gestural, intentionally imprecise strokes against landscapes rendered with large swaths of colour.









As he layers and works the canvas, prior approaches and experimentations are both removed and left visible, creating the sensation that the painting is teeming with action. Bright, shimmering colours collide, shifting the contours of the scene in and out of focus and producing the feeling of depth beneath the surface plane. The instability with which his works are laced also extends to his treatment of the body, as he explores not only the inherent beauty of the human form but the ways in which it changes and moves, in quick motions and through the slow passage of time.
